



Guido Antonelli is Full Professor of “Microbiology and Clinical Microbiology” at the Department of Molecular Medicine - Sapienza University in Rome since 2000. He is also head of the “Microbiology and Virology” Unit and of the Department of “Diagnostic Medicina and Radiology” at the Sapienza University Hospital “Policlinico Umberto I” in Rome.

He took a position at Institute of Virology/Sapienza University (1989) and then at the Department of Biomedicine/University of Pisa (1992); he worked also at the Department of Microbiology, University of Texas Medical Branch (Galveston, Texas, USA) and the Clinical Research Center, Division of Immunological Medicine (Harrow, London, UK).

His interest was initially focused on the in vivo and in vitro mechanism of production and action of interferons. His group’s research currently focuses on pathogenesis, control, and diagnosis of viral infections, particularly HIV, HCV, respiratory viruses, and HPV.

He participates in several national and international research projects and few years ago served for several years as president of SIVIM (Italian Society for Medical Virology). Today he is vice-President of SIM (Società Italiana di Microbiologia).

He has authored and co-authored more than 275 peer-reviewed articles and is now serving as co-editor or member of the editorial board of several peer-reviewed Journals.
